Casa de Amma started from a dream by founders Russ and Susie Leatherby. A place that could offer security and structure as well as thoughtful and individualized support, allowing each resident to grow and thrive in their own unique manner. Much of what is typically offered for adults with disabilities tends towards two extremes; either large, congregate living programs or small isolated home settings. Neither tends to offer the balance of independence and support that is needed. This is where we come in.

Our residents receive a specific support plan that addresses their strengths and challenges, giving them the encouragement they need in a caring and responsive setting. They are able to experience meaningful events which are often taken for granted by most of us, such as employment, regular outings with friends and having their own apartment.
